If in an aerosol can, discharge contents of container into a cardboard box. Allow to dry, then dispose of box & can in the trash.

Antifreeze: In the City, antifreeze may be flushed down toilet or sink using large amounts of water. Pour slowly and carefully to avoid splashing. Do NOT pour down septic system or storm sewer.

Fluorescent Bulbs: It is unlawful to dispose of fluorescent bulbs in Ohio landfills. Breaking fluorescent bulbs releases mercury vapor.
